

Mezzo soprano Felicia Gavilanes has been praised for her "rich mezzo-soprano" sound and passionate delivery of text and poetry.

Ms. Gavilanes' performances have taken her throughout the East Coast and abroad, appearing recently as Baba the Turk in *The Rake's Progress*, Donna Elvira in *Don Giovanni*, Tisbe in *La Cenerentola* and Flora in *La Traviata*.

Excited by contemporary works, Ms. Gavilanes recently performed the roles of Mrs. Gibbs in *Our Town*, Asakir in the Boston premiere of Fairouz's *Sumeida's Song* and Mrs. DeRocher in Boston Opera Collaborative's acclaimed production of *Dead Man Walking*.

Recent oratorio roles include Queen Jezebel and Angel in Mendelssohn's *Elijah* with the Tallahassee Community Chorus, in which her voice was described as "the perfect balance of power and beauty."

Ms. Gavilanes earned a Master of Music with Honors from the New England Conservatory and a Bachelor Degree from Dartmouth College.

Ms. Gavilanes currently studies with David Okerlund.
